Habitat for Humanity of Omaha's Emergency Home Repair Program provides homeowners with fast, affordable furnace replacement and repairs

Omaha, NE (February 13, 2020) – As temperatures drop this cold winter season, furnace failures can become emergencies for homeowners who can't afford to make urgent repairs on their own. Homeowners in need of furnace replacement or repairs can reach out to Habitat for Humanity of Omaha for help.

Through Habitat Omaha's Emergency Home Repair Program, the nonprofit partners with homeowners in need of urgent repairs, including mechanical failure of a furnace. Qualified households receive a no-interest loan to help address health and safety concerns in their homes.

"A large population of homeowners in Omaha cannot afford to replace their furnace," said Danyelle Baratta, Habitat Omaha Home Improvement Programs manager. "No one should have to live without heat during this time of year."

Through this program, a furnace can be replaced within 48 hours of submitting a qualifying application. Any homeowner experiencing problems with their furnace is encouraged to apply.
